

## What the Bible Teaches About God

**Read: Psalm 139, Isaiah 40 and Acts 17:22-31**


1. **Q.** What does the Bible teach about God?
  - A.** The Bible teaches that God is a Spirit. God is infinite, eternal and unchangeable in His being and also in His holiness, justice, wisdom, power, goodness and truth. There is only one God. He consists in three Persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.
  
2. **Q.** What is a brief summary of all that a true Christian should believe?
  - A.** The Twelve Articles of our Christian faith, called "The Apostolic Creed."
  
3. **Q.** How are these Twelve Articles divided?
  - A.** Into four parts:
    - (a) The first part speaks of God the Father and our creation.
    - (b) The second speaks of God the Son and our redemption.
    - (c) The third speaks of God the Holy Spirit and our sanctification.
    - (d) The fourth speaks of the Church of Jesus Christ and the blessings she receives from Him.

*With this lesson, we begin a study of the great teachings of the Bible as outlined in the Twelve Articles of the Apostolic Creed. The Apostolic Creed is not literally found in the Bible, but it contains the teachings which the apostles taught. It was formulated by the Christian Church in its present form approximately A.D. 500.*

*In this lesson we learn about God, His being, His divine attributes, and His existence as the triune God. God is great; He is infinitely great; therefore we cannot possibly comprehend Him.*

*We should not attempt this either. We should rather pray to God that He may give us a child-like spirit so that we may humbly bow before His holy Majesty, that we may confess our sins, and earnestly plead for His mercy.*

*It should be our chief desire in life to learn to know God in His sacred love and compassionate mercy revealed in Christ. Those who know God by His Holy Spirit's grace will humbly worship Him and they will gladly obey His will.*



## I. God is a Spiritual Being


