The resurrection of the body is a glorious hope for all who have repented of their sins and believed in Jesus Christ. They can look forward to it without fear. But it will be a terrible time for all who have died unsaved. They will cry to the mountains and rocks to fall on them and hide them from the face of Jesus (Revelation 6:16).

For some people it is difficult to believe in the resurrection of the body. For when we die, our whole earthly tabernacle is dissolved. Every part is doomed to corruption and mingles with the dust of the earth. Some people were eaten by animals or fish in the sea.

Those who were buried have been drawn up into plant life. Some people were cremated and from a plane their ashes were scattered by the winds.

But regardless of what has happened to our bodies, Scripture teaches that in the resurrection our bodies will be raised and reunited to our souls (Job 19:25,26).
