## Jude

Jude is very similar to II Peter. Peter warned of the increasing damage false teachers would cause in the future. Jude also focuses on false teachers, but in the present.

As unprincipled men, under the name of Christians, had crept in the church, whose chief object was to lead the unstable and weak to a profane contempt of God, Jude first shows, that the faithful ought not to have been moved by agents of this kind, by which the Church has always been assailed. He also exhorts them carefully to beware of such pests and to render them more hateful and detestable. Now, if we consider what Satan has attempted in our age, from the commencement of the revived gospel, and what arts he still busily employs to subvert the faith, and the fear of God, what was a useful warning in the time of Jude, is more than necessary in our age. But this will appear more fully as we proceed in reading the Epistle. – Adapted from J. Calvin

### Lord's Day #48

**Question 123:** Which is the second petition?

**Answer:** "Thy kingdom come"; that is, rule us so by thy word and Spirit, that we may submit ourselves more and more to thee; preserve and increase thy church; destroy the works of the devil, and all violence which would exalt itself against thee; and also all wicked counsels devised against thy holy word; till the full perfection of thy kingdom take place, wherein thou shalt be all in all.

\_\_\_\_\_. They are not known as false teachers, they are like Judas, a wolf in sheep's clothing. These false teachers are ordained to condemnation, for they turn the \_\_\_\_\_ of God into lasciviousness. *Lascivious* means lustfulness. As Lange's commentary puts it: "They draw the daring conclusion: Because God is so merciful, because Christ hath redeemed us from sin, because this and that sin have been passed unpunished, therefore we need not be so particular concerning sin." These people deny the \_\_\_\_\_ Lord God and our Lord Jesus Christ.

5. After that introduction, Jude gives three OT examples of apostasy (turning from God) where God's justice and judgments have followed:
  - a. God brought His people out of \_\_\_\_\_, but afterward destroyed them that believed not.
  - b. The fallen \_\_\_\_\_ who kept not there first estate (heaven), but rebelled against God, are reserved to everlasting \_\_\_\_\_ (No hope of a Savior, as living mankind has).
  - c. God rained fire and \_\_\_\_\_ (Gen. 19) on Sodom and Gomorrah and the cities around them because they had given themselves over to \_\_\_\_\_ and went after strange flesh (homosexuality). This is set as an example, suffering the vengeance of \_\_\_\_\_ fire. They will never be restored.
6. All false teachers are called filthy \_\_\_\_\_ who defile the \_\_\_\_\_, despise dominion, and speak evil of \_\_\_\_\_. Jude next gives a comparison showing the daring and criminality of their blaspheming. Even \_\_\_\_\_ the archangel did not venture to accuse Satan. Jude notes that Michael is given the responsibility of the burial of \_\_\_\_\_. When the devil disputed with Michael, Michael said, "The Lord \_\_\_\_\_ thee."
7. These false teachers speak evil of things that they don't \_\_\_\_\_. Then Jude compares them to many things:
  - a. Their understanding does not go beyond brute \_\_\_\_\_ which corrupt themselves.
  - b. These false teachers have gone in the way of \_\_\_\_\_, infamous for the \_\_\_\_\_ of his brother. So these false teachers will not stop at the destruction of any.

- c. These false teachers are greedy like \_\_\_\_\_ who ran after \_\_\_\_\_, loving the wages of unrighteousness. These false teachers are like those that followed \_\_\_\_\_. They used gainsaying speech against \_\_\_\_\_ and were swallowed by the earth. *Gainsaying* means to deny or contradict.

9. Note the following metaphors that describe the apostate teachers:

- a. These false teachers are like \_\_\_\_\_ in your feasts of charity. These "love feasts" the early church had were often connected to the Lord's Supper. These false teachers with seductive, dangerous power, stained a good thing.
- b. They are like clouds without \_\_\_\_\_ carried by the wind. When you look for rain in a dry season, you have hope when you see the clouds, but they have nothing in them. So deceptive are false teachers, having nothing of the grace of God in them.
- c. They are like a tree which has no root anymore, so they are trees without \_\_\_\_\_ are dried up (withered) or are without fruit, and called twice \_\_\_\_\_. They were born dead in trespasses and sins, pretending repentance were then baptized (pictured as rising out of death) and then apostatized into a second death.
- d. These false teachers are like raging waves of the sea, \_\_\_\_\_ out their own shame. "The wicked are like the \_\_\_\_\_ sea." (Isa. 57:20)
- e. They are wandering \_\_\_\_\_, to whom is reserved blackness and \_\_\_\_\_ forever. These professing Christians, professing to be lights of the world, instead of letting that light shine on more and more into the perfect day (Prov. 4: 18), are drifting about in strange errors in doctrine and practices.

10. Enoch, who walked with God, prophesied that the Lord will come with \_\_\_\_\_ of his saints to execute \_\_\_\_\_ and to convince all that are ungodly among them

desires of the flesh and the mind Eph. 2: 3), and have not the \_\_\_\_\_.

12. He now tells the body of Christ to build themselves on your most \_\_\_\_\_ faith,  
praying in the Holy Ghost, keeping yourselves in the \_\_\_\_\_ of God. You may  
ask, how can we do this? The answer lies in (the context of) the next phrase: "looking for the  
\_\_\_\_\_ of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life."

13. Jude shows his compassion for the weak as he says to  
have compassion, making a \_\_\_\_\_,  
i.e. if believers find only a spark of the love of Christ  
in them, have compassion on them and separate them  
in your judgment and conduct from others. Others,  
Jude says to save with fear, pulling them out of the  
\_\_\_\_\_. What Jude is warning here  
is that in trying to save someone from false doctrine,  
beware lest you be pulled to their side, falling prey to  
their ruin. When a believer pulls them out, their  
compassion for them must go hand in hand with a  
sincere hatred for the evil connected with their false doctrine. Therefore Jude adds, hating even  
the \_\_\_\_\_ spotted by the \_\_\_\_\_.

#### Lord's Day #52

**Question 127:** Which is the sixth petition?

**Answer:** "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil"; that is, since we are so weak in ourselves, that we cannot stand a moment; and besides this, since our mortal enemies, the devil, the world, and our own flesh, cease not to assault us, do thou therefore preserve and strengthen us by the power of thy Holy Spirit, that we may not be overcome in this spiritual warfare, but constantly and strenuously may resist our foes, till at last we obtain a complete victory.

14. 'Lastly, Jude ends with a precious doxology: "Now unto him that is \_\_\_\_\_ to  
keep you from falling, and to \_\_\_\_\_ you faultless before the presence of his  
glory with exceeding joy, to the only \_\_\_\_\_ God our Savior, be glory and
