## The Importance of the Final Judgment

First of all, the history of the world is not a sequence of senseless insignificant events that will continue for ever; it is rather a dynamic movement toward a definite purpose.

Secondly, the final judgment will be the full realization of the divine and blessed victory of God's redeeming love in Christ. Evil will be conquered for ever. The final judgment will be the ultimate revelation of the supreme triumph of the Redeemer from sin.

Thirdly, the final judgment is the clearest revelation that salvation in a blissful eternity is the exclusive fruit of divine grace and depends on being united to Christ by the sovereign grace and power of the Holy Spirit.

Fourthly, the eternal certainty of the final judgment is a strong confirmation of our personal responsibility to God our Maker and Provider for our entire life and existence here on earth.

Fifthly, all our thoughts, words, and deeds will be judged and no one will be able to find the smallest flaw in the justice of our holy Judge.

In conclusion, the most urgent call to the sinner is, "Prepare to meet your Maker and your Judge!" Do not waste your time; use it wisely. Value the instruction of your precious Bible. Prayerfully search the Word of God.

Plead for the gracious assistance of God's Holy Spirit. Christ saves everyone who comes to Him as a needy sinner begging for pardon. Christ can do more for you than anyone else. He alone does save, even the worst of sinners. Escape the wrath to come. Flee to the gracious Saviour. He is the only trustworthy and compassionate Refuge made known to us in the Gospel. Make haste for your life's sake.
