
The Bible, Our Infallible Teacher

Read: Deuteronomy 11:18-21

1 Q. *Where do we learn the true way of salvation?*

A. *We learn the true way of salvation from the Bible.
The Bible is the Word of God.*

2 Q. *What great truths does the Bible teach us?*

A. *The Bible teaches:*

- (1) The holy majesty and infinite glory of the only living and true God.*
- (2) The wondrous divine creation of the heavens and the earth and of man in the likeness of God.*
- (3) The fall of man and the origin of sin.*
- (4) The greatness of man's sin and misery, and his inability to deliver himself.*
- (5) God's redeeming love in Christ Jesus. This is the central theme of the Bible. The Old Testament foretells the coming of Christ. The New Testament tells us of the wonder of Christ's coming to this sinful world, of His lowly birth, of His precious Person (He is both God and Man), of His perfect sinless life, of His death in the place of sinners, of the good news that He arose from the grave, of His ascension into heaven, and that He is now seated at the right hand of His Father. Christ is the only Redeemer from sin. Every sinner needs Him!*
- (6) The person and the work of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit applies the salvation accomplished by Christ to the heart of sinners. He is the Author of the New Birth, and the Teacher of all God's people.*
- (7) Christ will return on the Judgment Day. That Day will be majestic. Christ will be the Judge. God's people may look forward to that great Day with a holy, joyful confidence. Their redemption will then be completed. But sinners who remain impenitent will then receive the due reward of their sins. Sad to say, their eternal future will be darkness, desolation and death.*

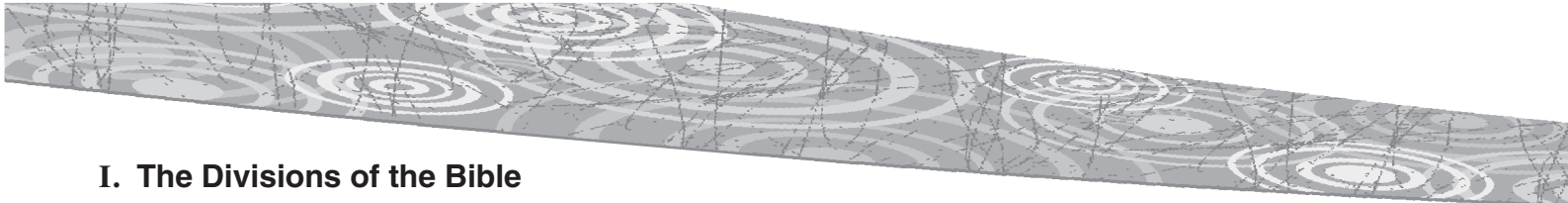

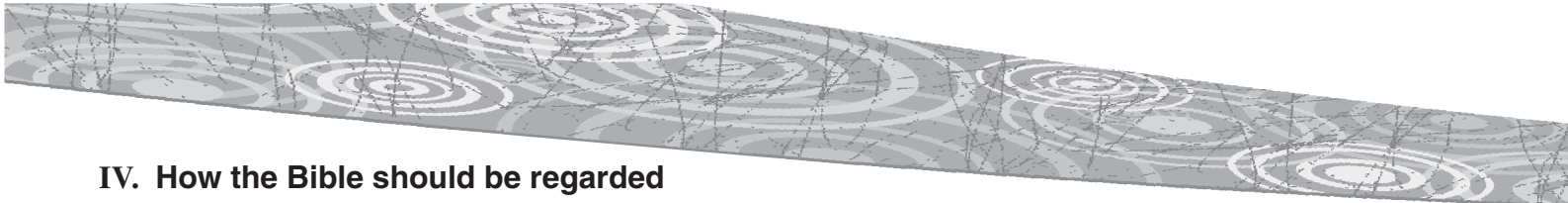
