Read Galatians 2

Circumcision is the surgical procedure of cutting off the male foreskin. This was instituted by God as a sacrament and a sign of the covenant between Him and Abraham. It was to be

practiced by all of Abraham's descendents and any adherents to the Jewish religion. After Christ's death (when His work was complete), this bloody sacrament changed to the bloodless sacrament of baptism. Paul, who was circumcised himself, did not compel new converts to be circumcised. This was an offense to the Jewish tradition, since the Jews did not believe that the Messiah was come, and they therefore continued to circumcise their children.

2.	Some false brethren (Judaizers) came to spy on Paul and Titus. What were they

	zealous or eager to do.) There were many very poor Christians in Judea, because of			
	the great persecution of that time.			
5.	In Antioch, Paul saweating with Gentiles (the			
	"uncircumcised"), but when the (the "circumcised") came,			
	he withdrew himself. This was offensive to Paul. Evenwas			
	carried away with their dissimulation (two-faced hypocrisy). (He had yielded to the			
	pressure of the situation.)

	Moses (ceremonial laws) or in being circumcised that one is saved. We must be born			
	again by faith, trusting in the finished work of the Lord Jesus (Galatians 2: 16).			

Heidelberg Catechism Question 60. How are thou righteous before God?

Answer: Only by a true faith in Jesus Christ; so that, though my conscience accuse me, that I have grossly transgressed all the commandments of God, and kept none of them, and am still inclined to all evil; notwithstanding, God, without any merit of mine, but only of mere grace, grants and imputes to me, the perfect satisfaction, righteousness and holiness of Christ; even so, as if I never had had, nor committed any sin: yea, as if I had fully accomplished all that obedience which Christ has accomplished for me; inasmuch as I embrace such benefit with a believing heart.

9. Justify (justification) = to prove the justice of, to vindicate, to excuse

Note: When the Bible speaks of justification, it means "a gracious work of God whereby He, as righteous Judge, acquits the elect from guilt and punishment and declares them to be heirs of eternal life because of the righteousness of Christ the Surety, imputed to them by God, and received by them through faith. (Brakel)
