

# **MEDITATION**



The Gift of the Sabbath

"And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it He had rested from all His work which God created and made."

Genesis 2:3

et me point **to the gift of the Sabbath**. It is the gift of a day. It is a gift of time, yes to be used different from every other day and with a specific purpose, but it is a gift of time in order to consider our souls and the needs of our souls. For those who are busy at work, who have a family, who have many demands on them, there never seems to be enough time. People are overtired, overworked. They often feel rushed. They say: "I could really use some time off." Well, the Lord in His infinite mercy has given a Sabbath day. In fact, this was one of the first gifts God gave to man: the Sabbath.

We can give each other many gifts. Some people can even buy very expensive gifts for others. But who can give you a day? Who can say to you: "I would like to give you a gift of 24 hours to rest." Only God can give that to you.

And He does! Not only does He give us six days to work, but also one day for rest and for His service. What a precious gift Adam and Eve received from the Lord, the day after they were created: the Sabbath. And when man fell into sin, God did not take it away and say: "Now you may not have a day of rest anymore." True, man still has to work, in the sweat of his face (Gen. 3:19). He is busy, he can be tired, stressed. But the Lord in the midst of our busy lives says: "I want to give you this Sabbath day." And you know, sometimes you take some days of vacation, and then your co-workers say: you deserve a few days of vacation; you have worked so hard. But we can never say that about the Sabbath. We have not deserved it. It is a free, undeserved gift from God. Therefore, use this gift with care before it slips out of your fingers.

And this gift has been blessed. That is what it says in Genesis 2:3: "And God blessed the seventh day." There are three verbs used in Genesis 2:3: He blessed it, He rested, He sanctified it... or He hallowed it. Take this last verb: "He sanctified it." This tells us that He made this day holy. He set it apart. Just like dishes could be set aside for the service of the Lord in the tabernacle or the temple. Then you could not just take that dish from the tabernacle, and take it home for washing or cooking. No, it was set aside as holy. And that is how it is with this day. God has set this day apart (not every day, but this day only). It is a separate day from all the other days, a unique day,



a special day set aside for rest from our daily work and for the service of the Lord.

It is special, and we should look forward to this day and impress it upon our children. That can be done by eating special foods, reading special books, having special things, talking with them, interacting with them, telling them Bible stories, so that even though the children do not understand everything about the day they may realize it is a special day, especially for the Lord and His service.

But yes, there is also that verb in Genesis 2:3: "He blest it." He has appointed it to be a blessing to human beings. With this day He wants to pour out His love and grace into the hearts and lives of sinners. On this day we may draw upon His blessing, and find it to be a source of help, strength and refreshment. He has set this day aside especially for our good, our benefit, and our well-being. Of course, if we do not know the grace of God, and have no desire to know the mercy of God, then it will be a burdensome day, a boring day. But does that not say more about you than the Lord and this day of the Lord? If God has given this great gift, and blest it, and it means nothing to us, and we find it boring and not a blessing, that should tell you something about your heart towards the Lord. Yes, it is a good test of the state of your heart and your religion. How do you regard this day? As a blessing? As a burden? If it is a burden, should you not tell the Lord of the Sabbath, and ask Him to change you? I know that this is one of those commandments that even professing Christians want to stretch and push the boundaries, and ask: "Can you go to the beach on Sunday?" And people ask: can you do this, can you do that? But we don't do that with the sixth commandment, do we? We don't ask: how much can we hate and still not break the 6th commandment. Or how far can you go with the sin of adultery and still be ok? Or how small can the idol be so that we don't break the first commandment. But when it comes to the Sabbath day, people want to push its limits. But that is not the way. The Lord blessed it. And we don't need to get into a debate about what is allowed and not allowed. The point is we don't want to miss the blessing God wants us to have on this day. We don't want to throw away this blessing. It has been such a blessing to the people of God throughout the ages, and we don't want to lose the blessing.

There should be anticipation for this day. When you wake up on the morning of the Lord's Day we should be saying to each other: "The Lord has poured His blessing into today. He has blessed this day." When you go to bed at night we should ask ourselves: "Have I been blessed today? Did I receive a special gift today?" If not, why not? The Sabbath is a gift, a blessed gift.



# **EDITORIAL**

# **Updates on Auxiliaries and Committees**

In June we held a meeting to restructure and organize our efforts moving forward. Each of our committees and auxiliaries has provided a brief update on their current activities which you can find in the following pages. Notably, we have several new initiatives such as CLDA prison visits and the distribution of promotional bookmarks.

# Youth Engagement and Prison Ministry

Last month we presented an update on our activities and on our prison ministry to a youth group in Norwich. They helped us assemble hundreds of packages of Bible courses for prisoners. We encourage other youth groups to engage with us, as involving the next generation is a key objective.



# **Expansion of Scripture Diary Distribution**

This year, the distribution of scripture diaries to prisons has expanded. In

August, we printed 10,000 additional copies of the 2024 diary and 160,000 copies of the new 2025 diary. We also accommodated a request from the North American General Mission to print 10,000 copies of a Spanish version. By printing 170,000 diaries in English, French, and Spanish simultaneously, we achieved a very low cost per unit. We trust that God's word will always fulfill His purpose and request prayers for this sowing of the seed of God's word.



On the evening of Wednesday October 23, 2024, three representatives from the Canadian Lord's Day Association spoke at the NRC Norwich's Benjamin Youth Group Evening. Over 30 young people aged 14 – 18 listened attentively to Mr. J. Heikoop speak about the history of the CLDA, the work we do, and the importance of preserving the sanctity of the Lord's Day. Mr. R. Jansen spoke about the prison ministry the CLDA is involved with in the form of Daily Diary distribution as well as the Bible courses that inmates complete and send back to him for marking. He shared two handwritten letters sent to him from inmates who have completed the Bible courses. It

was encouraging to hear how these means have made an impact in the lives of these men during their time in prison. Mr. D. Scholten then spoke about the recent CLDA group visit to Maplehurst Correctional Complex and

offered firsthand experience of what it was like to go inside Canada's second largest prison. After a short break the students were very busy assembling Bible course material and packaging them into envelopes, ready to send off to inmates. If you would be interested in setting up a time for the CLDA to come and speak at your school or church function please reach out to any council member. We would be more than willing to share a little bit about the work of the CLDA. (Submitted by D.S.)



# Reflections on the Past 38 Years

# An Interview with a Founding Member of the CLDA, John Stubbe

- What circumstances led to the founding of the Canadian Lord's Day Association?
   This dates to the 1980s when large retail corporations lobbied the government to allow Sunday shopping.
- 2. What were some of the first activities of the association?
  To oppose Sunday operations, the CLDA dispatched a delegation to the Ontario Parliament Study Committee to present its arguments. One of the initial activities involved advocating against Sunday store openings. This included visits to various stores and businesses to express concerns and encourage adherence to Sunday closing regulations.
- 3. Who were the other founding members?

  Mr. Campbell and Mr. Schuit visited Norwich to present their proposal for establishing a committee to uphold the sanctity of the Lord's Day. I believe Mr. A. Koppert and I were among those invited to join this endeavour. (See complete list as recorded in the first newsletter of the Canadian Lord's Day Association published in September of 1986.)



- 4. There have been many discouragements in society during the years since the CLDA began. What encouragements have you noticed?
  - The CLDA has maintained its existence until the present, with the council demonstrating a strong desire to expand and improve its operations. While some members have chosen to leave the council, others have been recruited to take their place. Annual meetings have offered a valuable platform for members to gather and listen to a range of speakers who have shared insights on the importance of the Lord's Day.
- 5. Considering how much has changed, what is the continuing importance of the work of the CLDA?

  The CLDA has a substantial opportunity to contribute to the promotion of the Lord's Day by supporting churches within our own community and across the nation. The true intent of the Lord's Day is often misunderstood, as it is commonly regarded as a day for personal leisure and enjoyment. As a result, many churches have faced challenges, and the dedication to the service of the Lord has diminished.
- 6. As the last founding member to leave the board, what advice do you have for the next generation? What should others remember as the work continues?

As the world faces increasing difficulties and challenges, there is a significant concern for the well-being of future generations. We hope that the work of the CLDA will continue to thrive, as it aligns with the divine commandment, "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy." We all have a moral obligation to care for those around us and to ensure a positive legacy for the next generation.

One of these inmates wrote: "They have given me a clearer and more meaningful understanding of the Bible. It has played a very important role in my journey to recovery from past transgressions." As a committee we had the opportunity to visit one of the prisons in Ontario. There we saw the need of our work, but also a God given opening not only to hand out daily diaries, but also to conduct Bible studies. May the Lord guide us when we would like to further develop this open door.

# 2025 Daily Diary Available in Spanish

We are thankful to announce that next year's Daily Diary has been printed in Spanish for the first time! The Spanish version was made in response to interest from the North American General Mission who minister to many Spanish-speaking people here in North America. The NAGM is also printing several thousand in Bolivia for distribution there. A limited number of 2025 Spanish diaries will also be available for CLDA distribution to Canadian penitentiary institutions and to distribute to migrant workers. The Spanish diary utilizes Scripture texts taken from the Santa Biblia Reina Valera translation which is equivalent to the English King James Version of the Bible. 
# **Visit to Maplehurst Correctional Complex**

On Tuesday, August 27, 2024, eight CLDA board members had the opportunity to visit the Maplehurst Correctional Complex in Milton, Ontario. The purpose of this visit was to meet the chaplains and tour the institution, as well as to deliver 3,000 Daily Diaries. The 2-hour visit

was deeply appreciated by both the members of the CLDA and the chaplains at Maplehurst and we look forward to future interactions. Below are some thoughts and reflections on the visit by Rev. Mulder who was part of the group:

This visit has deeply touched me. For the first time in my life, I saw how human beings were locked up in jail because of trespassing the law. Men with different ages (I saw young men who were about 18 years old, but also

seniors who were probably in their sixties and all ages in between), different skin colours, a different glance, different posture, and different behaviour (some were passive or turned more inwardly, others were more expressive or chatting or walking together 25 meters up and down). But also, men who wear the same orange dress (to show they are prisoners, almost without an own identity), men who were in the same department, men all locked up. In their own department, they do have three times a day to be together with their fellow inmates. The other part of the day they are in their own cell, which they share with two other inmates. Because the facility

world. To go there the inmates were surrounded by guards. And all these inmates (about 1,500 men) were observed and served by about 900 operational staff.

And I was walking there...on the other side of the glass wall. Looking towards inmates, with their own life, history, father and mother, dreams, struggles and sin. Yes, they all were there for a reason. All different crimes - murder,

sexual abuse, stealing etc. But they are still human beings. With their own identity. Over 95% of these men didn't grow up in a family with a father as an example. The lady who took us around told us that although she was very strict and consequent in treating the inmates and although she is daily confronted with horrible behaviour, she still treats all the inmates like a mother would. To treat them as human beings.

It was very impressive. To know of having the same heart, of being a fellow sinner, I had to ask myself, what makes the difference? Why was I on the good side of the glass wall? Why could I walk in and out in freedom? Not because I am better! Only by the grace of God. And in this environment, we, as the Canadian Lord's Day Association,

may provide these inmates with a daily diary, which is very much appreciated. Thousands of them are shared with the inmates from all over the country. With one message in it. The message of Scripture. God has given His only begotten Son as a sacrifice for ungodly men. Therefore, Jesus suffered not in the temple, but outside Jerusalem. God put Jesus' cross in the midst of two criminals to make atonement for the sins of this world. Christ became a criminal (2 Cor. 5:21) in order to give his righteousness to criminals out of free grace. A message which also is being brought more or less by the chaplains who received us so kindly. It is a privilege but also a duty to continue this important work of sharing God's Word in this way. As a light in such a dark place and for dark hearts. It was important to meet the chaplains and to build a relationship with

them. It seems that there are other opportunities connected with sharing the daily dairies to share God's Word in the Maplehurst Correction Centre in Milton. We will discuss that

as a prison committee and board.

This visit has definitely changed my mind about prisoners, their guards, but also on the work of the CLDA.



# Updates of Activities of Local Auxiliaries

# **British Columbia**

# A Man from the Old Days



The skipper was ready. He had worked hard, sometimes well into the night to get the job done. Finally the ship was loaded, and he was ready to sail. On the evening before he left he met his uncle, who lived in the city of his destination.

"When are you planning to depart? he asked him.

"Early tomorrow, as soon as it's light."

"Tomorrow?" the uncle asked in astonishment. "Did you forget that tomorrow is Sunday?"

"No, I haven't forgotten that, but I can't worry about whether it's Sunday or Monday. I have to worry about the wind and since it is favourable I can't wait one day longer," was the answer.

"I'm sorry about that", said Uncle. "I remember that your grandfather, who was also a skipper, used to say, 'On Sundays my ship must rest as well'. He never experienced any disadvantages from that. When he passed away, he left your father a nice bequest, and he had often said, 'That money contains a Sabbath blessing obtained through Sabbath rest."

"Oh, Uncle, Grandfather was a man from the old days. If he was alive now he would talk differently. Nowadays you have to work hard to get ahead and if you don't then others will catch up to you or pass you by. That is hard on the wallet, Uncle!"

"Yes," said Uncle. "I have known many people who raced ahead but had to return with their tail between their legs. Do me a favour, and don't sail tomorrow. You can't expect a blessing on it, my boy."

"No," answered the skipper, "I'm all set and I will sail."

"In that case, I will tell you something else," replied Uncle. "I sailed with your grandfather a few times. I still look back on those times with pleasure. Just before we loosened the ropes and set sail, your grandfather called his deckhands together, removed his hat and, while standing, prayed together with them to petition the Lord for His blessing. If we arrived at a city or town on a Saturday, the ship was moored. We attended church service, or if the distance was too great or the doctrine wasn't pure, then a sermon was read, and I think that even the fish could hear it. Your grandfather became ninety-two and, on his deathbed, he was able to say that during all his travels he never had a disaster. Follow his example, my boy, and it shall go well with you."



The ship had sailed ahead with speed and the skipper had estimated that he would arrive well ahead of schedule. But suddenly the ship had run aground into a sandbank that had just formed. He could not get it afloat and asked his uncle to send a tugboat as soon as possible. Uncle got right to work, but it was Wednesday before the tug could pull the ship loose and it could get underway. A week later the uncle and nephew met each other again. Uncle didn't say a word of rebuke, but shame and remorse were written on the face of the skipper. He had suffered a big loss.



# The Dolphins.




On October 16, 1697, a sloop entered New Haven with seven men on board. They had been at sea for seventeen weeks. During that long voyage they had suffered terrible hunger, which had drastically increased the last five weeks. But they were a praying and Godfearing company. When those men cried to the Lord, He heard and saved them. God sent His dolphins to accompany them. They were able to catch a dolphin every day of the week from Monday to Friday, which was sufficient to save them from starvation. Saturday they caught two. On the Lord's Day, despite their best efforts, they didn't catch any. When they realized what they were doing on the Lord's Day, with contrition they stopped their attempts. They had been well provided for on Saturday.

The Lord continued to feed the company of men in this manner, and they put their trust in Him. Just as He had done with His people Israel, with His manna. That continued until they reached a different area and the dolphins had to leave the ship. Then the dolphins formed a noticeable group, and the company of men was able to catch twenty-seven of them. Not only was that sufficient food for the remainder of the journey but several were dried and brought to shore as a visible sign of God's goodness.





