Christ's Second Coming

Read: Matthew 24; 1 Thessalonians 4 &5; 2 Peter 3; Matthew 13:36-50

All throughout the New Testament we read about the solemn and blessed truth that Jesus Christ will come again. Christ Himself frequently spoke about His second coming and so did the Apostles.

From what the Scriptures teach us we may conclude that the event will be indescribably impressive. When He first came into this world it was in the remote little town of Bethlehem, but His second coming will be with unsurpassed majesty.

When Christ was here on earth men were able to reject and despise Him. Now that He has returned to heaven sinful men may do the same or even worse. However, when He comes again it will not be possible to ignore the reality of the infinite grandeur of His Person.

A countless host of mighty angels will be His attendants. These angels are called mighty on account of their inconceivable strength. At Christ's return they will be sent to separate the righteous from the unrighteous. They will cast the wicked into hell and the godly will be ushered into heaven. See Matthew 13:49, 50.

The majesty of Christ's appearance will be greatly enhanced as He will be surrounded by "flaming fire". See Daniel 7:9, 10. The world on which we now live shall be on fire, the elements shall melt with fervent heat, and the entire earth shall burst forth in one vast worldwide blaze of fire. See 2 Peter 3:10.

Human language cannot express and human imagination cannot conceive how fearful this scene will be. The Bible gives a fitting description of that day as "the great and very terrible day of the Lord". See Joel 2:11.

The Old Testament contains numerous promises regarding the coming of the Redeemer from sin. The first coming of the Saviour was clearly foretold. Abraham and others with him rejoiced to see Christ's day. There are also many references in the Old, but especially in the New Testament concerning the second coming of the Lord.				
His first coming was in lowliness; His second coming will be exceedingly glorious. At His second coming the redemption of the righteous will be completed and the wicked will be punished.				
The redemption of the righteous will be completed. Who are these righteous? The only people that will be saved are they who have believed in Christ and have been sanctified by His Holy Spirit.				
The salvation of the soul of the believer is complete at the day of the believer's death and the soul departs to be forever with the Lord. The body reposes in the grave until the Final Day. Then it will be raised an incorruptible body.				
Blessed spirits will be reunited to glorified bodies. Soul and body will be joined anew in a perfect indissoluble union. Thus salvation will be completed in eternal perfection.				
On the Day of Days the wicked will be punished. Christ will "take vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Thessalonians 1:8, 9).				
Mere theoretical knowledge, however sound it may be, will be of no avail in that great Day. We need an experiential knowledge of the grace of God as it has been made known to us in the Gospel.				
We must know our dependence on Christ as our only Saviour and Redeemer. All who do not cordially embrace the Gospel will perish for ever! We must flee to Jesus, the only Refuge and Hiding place! While He offers peace and pardon let us hear His voice to day.
