

The Mediator Who Saves

Read: II Corinthians 5:17-21; Ephesians 2:11-19
Memorize: John 14:6; Acts 4:12; I Timothy 2:5

A mediator is a person who settles differences between two disagreeing parties. Usually mediation takes place by common consent and friendly invitation. By his sin man has offended his holy Maker and heavenly Benefactor. Man, the sinner, is filled with enmity against his God. Therefore God is justly displeased and His wrath is kindled against man.

The all-important question is, how can sinners be forgiven and obtain peace with God? Some have suggested that God can pardon sinners without a mediator. However, in this lesson we will learn that this is altogether impossible.

The Bible clearly teaches that without a mediator a holy God and sinful man can never be reconciled. The amazing wonder of God's love is that God Himself has provided a Mediator in the person of His only begotten Son. Christ, the Son of God, is the only Mediator between God and man. He is such a Mediator both in respect of His person and His work. As person, He is One that has the same nature both with God and man; He is true God and true man.

As regards His work, the Mediator was required to live a sinless life and to die an atoning death, and thus to bring about the needed reconciliation that brings men to God. The Good Shepherd voluntarily gave His life for His sheep.

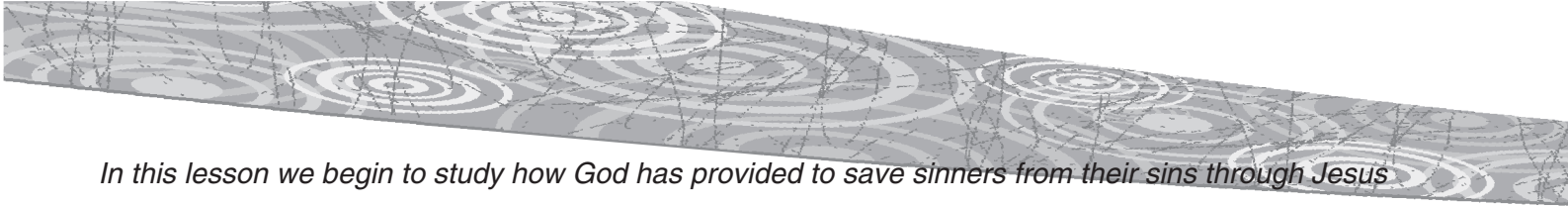
A. Because He stands between a holy God and sinful man.

We gain this knowledge through a careful study of the Bible and the enlightening grace of the Holy Spirit.

We must never forget to pray, "Lord be pleased to enlighten my heart and mind by Thy Holy Spirit's grace, that I may see the shame and guilt of my sin and Thy wondrous grace revealed in the Saviour from sin. Oh let me as a poor sinner fly to a rich Christ."

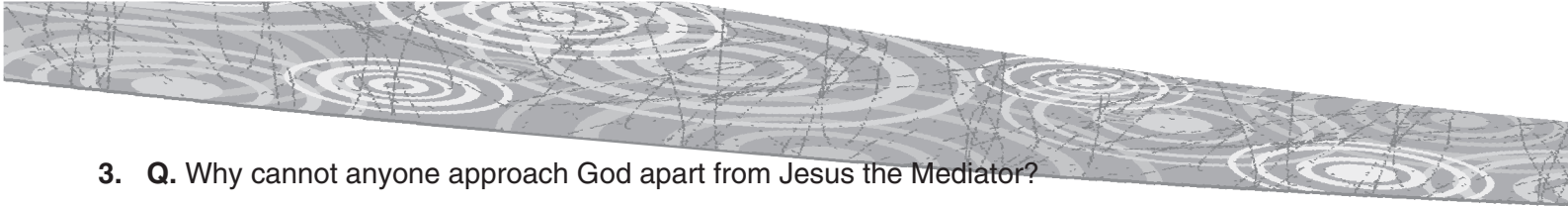
