

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the Dead

Read: Matthew 28; Mark 16; Luke 24; John 20, 21; 1 Corinthians 15:1-26

The Gospel begins with the remarkable narrative of the birth of the Saviour. It closes with another not less important message of the resurrection of Christ. These two historic events are powerful testimonies to the unique character of the Christian faith.

The Saviour's triumphant resurrection is of as great a value as His wondrous and lowly birth. The Christian message of salvation reaches its climax in this supernatural act of God. By raising Jesus from the grave, God the Father expressed His delight in the atonement accomplished at Calvary. At the cross Christ cried out, "It is finished."

The resurrection is the Father's approval of this victory. The amazing miracle spreadslight on the sufferings of the Son of Man. What appeared to be a tragic defeat was in reality the most important victory ever gained.

The resurrection is likewise a powerful confirmation of the teachings of Jesus. Every doctrine taught by Christ was verified by this divine intervention. The wonder of God's redeeming love and power is fully made known in the glory of the risen Saviour.

They are:

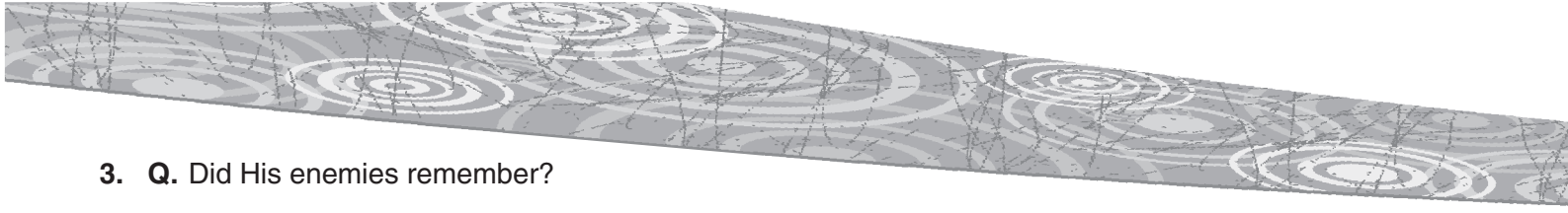
- (a) His resurrection,*

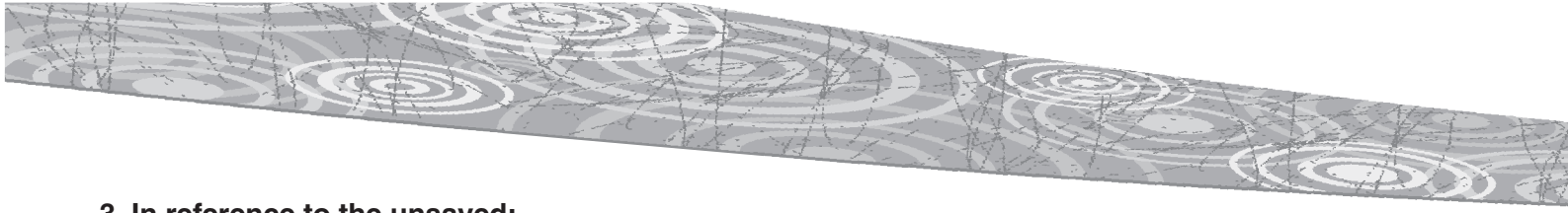

A Pastoral Message

When the matchless miracle of the resurrection of Jesus took place early on the first day of the week, the followers of the Lord were not aware of it. They were still mourning. The news of the empty tomb caught them by surprise. It seemed too wonderful to believe that Christ had risen.

The disciples desired certainty. They longed for the One who was the secret of their joy and peace. He first appeared to Mary Magdalene and the other women who had so lovingly watched His crucifixion and burial. When Simon Peter had related the news of Christ's personal appearance to him, the disciples were sufficiently confirmed in their faith to cry out, “The Lord is risen indeed.” Fresh hope was kindled in the hearts of Christ's followers.

The various subsequent appearances of the risen Saviour were all confirmations of the good news. When the Lord had ascended and poured out His Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost, the disciples proclaimed the Gospel of Christ with boldness. Christ is risen indeed!

This doctrine assures us that Christ is preparing a place for His people, and that He will come again to receive them to Himself. It is as certain as Christ was raised from the grave that one day the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and they will come forth from their graves. Then Christ will be the Judge of all mankind, and will make the solemn separation between the wheat and the chaff.
