The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

Read: Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15, 16; Acts 8:26-40

Lesson 18

In the third chapter of the Gospel according to John we read about Jesus' interview with Nicodemus. Nicodemus was a religious man. He was a well-respected Pharisee. He even belonged to the Jewish Sanhedrin.

Moreover, Nicodemus was Israel's most distinguished teacher of his day. Undoubtedly he had received the Old Testament sign of the covenant and was circumcised on the eighth day. With all his special privileges and advantages, Nicodemus was yet a real stranger to the deepest religious need of his heart.

In his own experience he did not know the cry of the psalmist, "Create in me a clean heart, O God and renew a right spirit within me" (Psalm 51:10a). The sympathizing Christ was deeply moved with the spiritual poverty of Nicodemus.

Therefore in His straightforward and compassionate way Christ told him: "Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3, 5&7).

At first Nicodemus did not understand what he heard. In His gracious faithfulness, Jesus explained and insisted, "You must be born again!"

The new birth is a radical and blessed change, made in the heart of a sinner by the grace and power of God the Holy Spirit. The new birth is a precious wonder whereby we become spiritually alive. So, and so alone, begins a life that never ends!

"Marvel not that I said unto thee, ye must be born again!"
