	tree (picture of the Gentiles) was not very		
	fruitful. So the Gentiles were unfruitful in holiness. The		
	Jews were like a cultivated olive tree under the training and		
	blessing of God. Paul admonishes the Gentiles not to boast		
about being grafted into that ancient root or stock, Abraham. They didn't			
	themselves into this root, God did. The Jews who were not bearing fruit in the time		
	of Paul's ministry are like the branches, which were off (v.		
	19), because of (v. 20). Now a strong warning comes to us		
	(Gentiles): "If God spared not the natural, take heed		
	lest he spare not thee." (v. 21) God is able to graft them (Jews) in again (v.23).
