Read Revelation 17

Vision #6:
The Mystery
Woman

The entire book of Revelation is a series of visions. Chapters 17 - 19 include the  $6^{th}$  of 7 visions. This is the vision of the "Mystery Woman." Chapter 17 describes her; Chapter 18 tells of her downfall; and Chapter 19 is the resulting rejoicing and worshipping. The word "mystery" is used in the New Testament sometimes as a technical term referring to "God's open secret." God reveals the mystery to His people. Think of Matthew 13:11, where Christ responds to the disciples question of why He spoke in parables, "...Because it is give unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it is not given." Another passage says, "Behold, I show you a mystery; we shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed..." (I Corinthians 15:51).

This woman has sometimes been wrongly defined as the church, the Roman Catholic Church, or the apostles. This is not the same woman as the one in chapter 12. She is a prostitute not an adulterer. She has never been married to Christ. She is an immoral woman and also representative of a city at the same time. The best way to gain insight regarding her is to stay with Scripture (don't speculate outside of Scripture) and go to the Old Testament for insight.

- 3. Now look at Daniel 4:30. The king spake, and said "Is not this great \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, that I have built for the house of the kingdom by the might of my power and for the honor of my majesty?" Babylon is a symbol of 'this world' in opposition to God. The lust of the flesh, lust of the eye, and pride of life is the world and it is in each of us. The woman represents worldly pleasure around and in us.
- 4. The woman has a double strategy. Her main strategy is to destroy Christ's kingdom through worldliness. Rev. 17:2 says, "with whom the \_\_\_\_\_ of the earth have committed fornication, the and of the earth have been made drink with the wine of her fornication. No part of society is save, not even the church. All will be tempted: rich, poor, leaders, workers, male, female. The devil even attempted to get Christ to fall to the temptation for possessions and pride ("All these things will I give thee, if thou wilt fall down and worship me" Matt. 4:9).

Those drunk with the wine of the woman constantly seek for more – they are not satisfied. However, Christ has said, "Whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst."

5.	The woman's second strategy is persecution. "And I saw the woman drunken with

6.	The woman has support – note that she is sitting upon seven

7.	Yet, the woman is really frail, she is not loved, but used. Behind her flashy
	clothes and painted face is emptiness, a wilderness. When the devil has no more
	use for her, he will "make her, and

## Meditation

He that endureth to the end shall be saved. Matt. 10:22 and 24:13

We began the year seeing Jesus. O, in this blessed sight let us endure to the end. In Him we see a complete salvation. We hear and believe his cry from the cross, "It is finished." We hear him proclaim from his throne in glory, "It is done." Rev. 21:6. In him we are "chosen to salvation, through sanctification of the Spirit, and belief of the truth." 2Thess. 2:13. He "of God, is made unto us wisdom, righteousness, sanctification and redemption." 1.Cor. 1:30. In the faith of this we persevere. By faith we endure (every fight of affliction) seeing him who is invisible." Heb. 11:27. We "run with patience the race set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and fisher of our faith." Heb. 12:2 Consider these precious words, ye who tremble lest your faith shall not endure to the end: the same Jesus who is the author is also the finisher of your faith. It is the glory of gospel faith to live upon Jesus who is our life and salvation; and to enjoy life and salvation in Christ where in spite of all the deceitfulness of sin, and the art and malice of Satan, we will "receive the end of our faith, the salvation of our souls." 1 Peter 1:9
